



How to Interact with your Elected Officials at Town Hall Meetings

Eagle Forum encourages you to make use of the following helpful tips in preparation for the many Town Hall meetings which will be held over the 2009 August Recess.

First—

Sign-up for Eagle Forum Town Hall meeting alerts so you will always know when your Congressman and Senators are holding an event. *(In order to be assigned to your proper Congressional District, you must provide your complete street address where you are registered to vote.)*

Second—

Check your email daily for Eagle Forum notices about upcoming Town Hall meetings in your state and district.

Third—

Forward the notices to family and friends and attend the meetings as a group to make for both a fun and informative outing together!

Fourth—

Prepare questions ahead of time to ask your elected officials during the meeting. We also encourage you to make bold statements with home-made signs and respectful paraphernalia to help communicate your concerns to your Representatives.

Fifth—

Bring materials to back-up your arguments, such as the text of a bill, newspaper articles or press releases with quotes from your Representatives, etc.

Sixth—

Have fun! Although there are many serious issues that should be addressed, Town Hall meetings offer rare opportunities not only to meet your elected officials for the first time, but they also provide for networking and meeting new people who share the same conservative views as you!
