

Every Missouri voter must answer this question:

“Shall Judge Richard B. Teitelman of the Missouri Supreme Court be retained in office? Yes No”

Liberal Democratic Governor Bob Holden will be out of office at the end of this year — his own party repudiated him in the August Primary. But regardless of who is elected our new Governor, Bob Holden’s leftwing policies will continue in Missouri for the foreseeable future because **Holden appointed 3 of the 7 judges on the Missouri Supreme Court!** The Missouri Supreme Court now has a 5-2 liberal majority. Even the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* stated that the Democrats on the Missouri Supreme Court “are generally considered to be liberal-minded Democrats.”

These Holden judges have already caused the Missouri Supreme Court to make a **radical turn to the left by their actions against marriage, against law enforcement, against gun ownership, and for abortion.** The trouble with liberal judges is not only that they are leftwing, but they are usually activist judges who try to dictate leftwing policies contrary to the votes of our elected legislators and the will of the people.

Missouri voters **have only one chance** to protect ourselves against leftwing activist Missouri judges. Only one of Holden’s judges is on our November 2nd ballot: **Judge Richard B. Teitelman — and if he wins in November, he will be locked into this powerful office for 12 more years!**

Before his appointment to the Missouri court, Richard B. Teitelman spent 23 years as an activist for the **Legal Services Corporation** of Eastern Missouri. He was so important that this group named its building after him. The Legal Services Corporation is a very leftwing activist organization that spends taxpayers’ funds to litigate and lobby for radical causes. Hillary Clinton used to be the chairman of the national board of this group.

With Richard Teitelman in the new liberal majority, the Missouri Supreme Court handed down these shocking decisions:

- It nullified the death sentence of the infamous murderer who tied up Shirley Crook and threw her off a railroad trestle into the Meramec River to drown. (*State v. Simmons*, 2003)
- It put the gay-marriage ban on the August ballot where the Democrats thought it would have a smaller chance of success (it passed anyway by 71%). (*Nixon v. Blunt*, 2004)
- It upheld a lower Missouri court decision that effectively knocked out Missouri’s ban on partial-birth abortion. (*Missouri v. Planned Parenthood*, 2003)
- Teitelman wrote the decision in the case that knocked out one of Missouri’s longstanding pro-marriage laws. (*Helsel v. Noellsch*, 2003)

Teitelman sided with Holden in *trying* to hold Missouri’s new Concealed Carry Act unconstitutional. Fortunately, they failed. (*Brooks v. State*, 2004)

Teitelman wrote the controversial decision that knocked out Missouri’s tort reform laws aimed at limiting lawsuits against doctors. (*Scott v. SSM Healthcare*, 2002)
