Speaker: Stracke, Janae - Janae Stracke is the Director of Grassroots at Heritage Action for America. In this role she oversees a grassroots staff of 12 and leads the Sentinel Program-- an army of grassroots conservatives-- along with two million grassroots activists nationwide, towards a freer and more prosperous America. During her time in DC, Stracke has played a key role in engaging conservative activists with Supreme Court nominee confirmations. Prior to working for Heritage Action, Stracke worked for Concerned Women for America where she served as both National Field Director and Communications Coordinator. Stracke grew up on a farm in Western Iowa and attended Liberty University where she received a bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism and a double minor in public relations and psychology.

Title: *Biden's Radical Attack on the Two Sexes: How It is Detrimental to Women and Children*

I. The Issue

A. Biden's Department of Education is proposing a new rule that will put women's safety and privacy at risk, and deprive women of athletic and professional opportunities by rewriting Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972.

B. The rule change will redefine "sex" as used in Title IX to include "sex stereotypes, sex-related characteristics (including intersex traits), pregnancy or related conditions, sexual orientation, and gender identity."

II. The Damage: What's at Risk

A. Depriving women of safety and privacy – men will now have access to women's facilities, locker rooms, bathrooms, and dorms.

B. Depriving women of educational and career opportunities – men competing in women's sports will be able to hijack scholarships intended for female athletes.

C. Indoctrinating children with far-Left gender ideology.

III. The Solution: Action Items

B. File complaints with the Office for Civil Rights – OCR complaints can be filed by someone who has experienced discrimination or someone who knows of the alleged discrimination. OCR complaints are simple one-page forms that can be

C. Lobby for strong state policies – we need more states to take up women’s sports and parental rights bills that would offer a legal path toward protection from federal overreach. Heritage Action is now registered to lobby in 22 states and have regional coordinators on the ground to help guide your efforts.
