Speaker: Margaret Byfield is executive director of American Stewards of Liberty where she leads the organization's programs to protect American's property rights. She is an agricultural and natural resource expert, a nationally recognized speaker, writer, and advocate for landowners who produce our food, fiber, minerals, and energy. She helped expose and rollback the Biden Administration 30x30 agenda and stop Natural Asset Companies from being listed on the New York Stock Exchange.

Margaret's family was an early target of the radical environmental agenda. In 1991 her parents filed the first federal lands grazing takings case in the U.S. Court of Federal Claims, *Hage v. United States*. The case took 27 years to complete.

Byfield has appeared on national programs, including Epoch TV, FOX News, Glenn Beck and Steve Bannon's War Room. She has also been a guest speaker at Freedom Fest, CPAC and other programs across America.

Outline:

- Why: What is the purpose of the data centers?
- Resource use: propaganda or real concerns?
- Location: if a data center is right for your community, where should it go?
- Language: How do we fight and require both our government and these companies to do better?

Action Items:

- Be educated – this is such a nuanced conversation, find out if these data centers are right for your community's way of life
- Know who makes the decisions locally – every state runs things differently, know who the decision makers are in your area
- Spread the word – the community shows up and brings resources
- Find out your state's existing legislation – industrial vs commercial regulations and if data centers are regulated by state mandates
- Find out if new legislation is proposed
- Close the loopholes – not all legislation or local ordinance is created equally
